AIDS Healthcare Foundation (AHF) is a global nonprofit organization providing cutting-edge medicine and advocacy to over 1,600,000 people worldwide. They help bring this walk to life and provide vital services to the people of Atlanta.

Since 1987, AHF has cared for thousands of people living with HIV and AIDS worldwide. As they create and implement new programs in communities across the U.S. and abroad, they expand delivery of healthcare and influence over policy with the aim of saving more lives.



AID Atlanta has specialized in providing HIV and AIDS-related care, wellness services, and education and prevention programs since 1982. Founded in response to the severe impact HIV was having on Atlanta, AID Atlanta set out to stop new infections, care for people living with HIV and AIDS, and break the shame and stigma related to HIV.



A Vision for Hope prepares individuals to have the self-confidence to envision a better life, break away from the cycle of negativity and hopelessness, and affect change in their lives and communities. They offer a wide range of programs to help build stronger families and encourage community members to invest in their future. In so many ways, they are building A Vision 4 Hope one day at a time.



The Atlanta Harm Reduction Coalition, Inc. (AHRC) is a community-based wellness organization committed to promoting health and dignity by reducing the impact of HIV and AIDS, Hepatitis C, STI, and Substance Use within vulnerable communities. They envision a world where all people are accepted, valued, and have access to healthcare and support that leads to a fulfilling life.



The Center for Black Women's Wellness (CBWW) is a community-based, nonprofit organization in Atlanta with a mission to improve the health and wellbeing of underserved Black women and families. Celebrating a 32-year legacy, CBWW addresses health in a broad context and offers low-cost/no-cost healthcare, health education, prenatal home visiting, financial literacy, and microbusiness training.



Georgia Equality's mission is to advance fairness, safety and opportunity for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender communities, and our allies throughout the state.



Jerusalem House provides homeless and low-income individuals and families affected by HIV and AIDS in Greater Atlanta with a continuum of housing options, supportive services, and educational opportunities that contribute to a resident's overall self-sufficiency.









NAESM is one of the first African American community-based non-profit organizations to stand on the frontlines in the fight against HIV/AIDS in Atlanta, Georgia. Although NAESM serves a wide range of participants, its mission is to address the myriad health challenges facing Black gay, and bisexual men. NAESM's services include peer counseling; mental health and substance abuse counseling; psychosocial support; housing assistance; utility assistance; food and clothing pantries; transportation assistance; health education; free HIV and STD testing; risk reduction workshops; and capacity building assistance.



Positive Impact Health Centers provides client-centered care for the HIV community to have a life worth living. Comprehensive services are available at the Duluth and Decatur centers for those affected by HIV. Grant funding enables most services to be provided on a sliding fee basis.



The Recovery Consultants of Atlanta, Inc. (RCA, Inc.) is a private non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization founded in 1999 by a group of concerned, committed, and spiritually centered members of the Metro-Atlanta's 12-Step and faith-based addiction recovery communities.

Over the years, the organization has grown and expanded its services for both clients and patients by offering an array of comprehensive Primary Care Services through its Community Health Center which enhances and supplements all services being provided at RCA.

How do I create a Corporate Team?



Team Structure and Size

Corporate teams vary greatly depending upon the organization. Many companies choose to create one team under a single captain and encourage registration and fundraising toward a single corporate team goal. Another option is to break into smaller teams, based on characteristics like location or department. Each team will have its own team captain and can support different beneficiaries if they so choose. Challenges involving participation and fundraising are a fun way to engage employees regardless of the team structure. There is no limit to the number of participants that can join a team.



Role of the Team Captain

Team captains (and co-captains if you choose to have one) are the heart and soul of your corporate team. They will inspire colleagues to join and encourage members to fundraise.
