

Letter from the President

The National Health Council's Voluntary Health Agency members provide unique and indispensable services to individuals with life-threatening illnesses, chronic health conditions, and other physical and developmental disabilities and their families. More than 50% of the U.S. population directly or indirectly benefits from the services provided by these patient-based organizations through medical research, health-related advocacy, professional training, patient and family services, community services, and public education programs. Voluntary health agencies play a critical role in meeting needs that otherwise would go unmet. They are able to make these valuable contributions to society with the generous support of the donating public.

This report provides Fiscal Year 2000 aggregate and individual revenue and expense information for 41 of the Council's VHA member organizations. The data allow the reader to appreciate how each agency has invested in programs to fulfill its mission, how these dollars relate to total expenditures, and the extent of public support received. Donors should find this information helpful in philanthropic decision-making.

In Fiscal Year 2000, public support for the 41 agencies increased 14.09% over the previous fiscal year. Other revenues from sources such as government grants, sales and services, and membership dues increased 9.3%. The 12.8% increase in total revenues helped the agencies augment their program services expenditures by 12.7%.

The National Health Council reviews each member VHA annually to ensure conformity with the Council's Good Operating Practices standards. The Council developed its Good Operating Practices standards to ensure that all member VHAs fulfill the donating public's expectations for accountability and disclosure. Member agencies are required to make their annual reports and audited financial statements readily available to the public and make certain that the organization adheres to the highest ethical standards in fundraising practices and governance. These standards are detailed on the following pages.

In addition, the Council publishes the *Standards of Accounting and Financial Reporting for Voluntary Health and Welfare Organizations*, known commonly as "The Black Book" [please call the Council for ordering information]. These standards prescribe the functional accounting methodology used widely in the field and applied in this report. Except where noted, the report uses audited data for national offices and affiliates combined. Some aggregate total figures may vary slightly due to rounding factors.

The Council wishes to acknowledge with gratitude the 84% response rate by its member VHAs for this project. We hope this report proves useful to you and welcome any comments or questions you may have.

CATEGORY DEFINITIONS FOR FY 2000 REPORT

The financial information included in the *Report of Voluntary Health Agency Revenues and Expenses* is provided by the agencies included in the Report. The overall categories of revenues and expenses conform to Generally Accepted Accounting Principals (GAAP) and the categories defined in the Standards of Accounting and Financial Reporting for Voluntary Health and Welfare Organizations, published by the National Health Council and National Assembly of Health & Human Service Organizations.

REVENUE CATEGORIES

Public Support

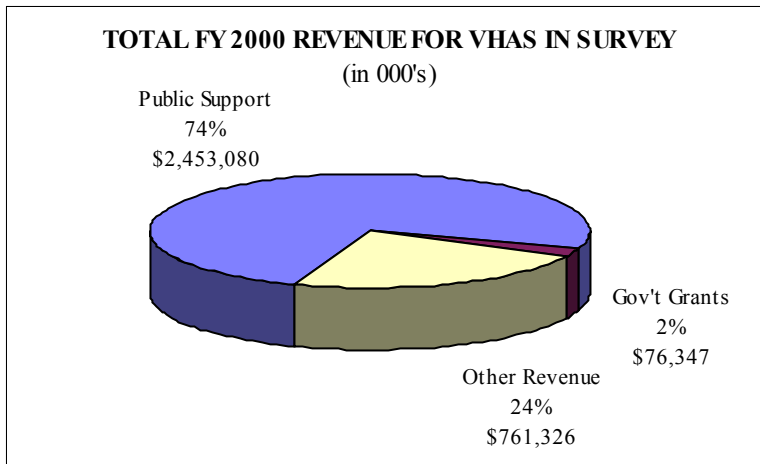
Represents charitable giving by donors to support the activities of voluntary health organizations through special events, bequests, amounts received from federated and non-federated fund-raising campaigns, governments, etc.

Government Grants

Includes amounts received by organization through grants from federal and state agencies.

Other Revenue (Exchange Transactions)

Includes amounts earned by organizations through dues, fees, sales, investments, and other income-producing activities.

EXPENSE CATEGORIES

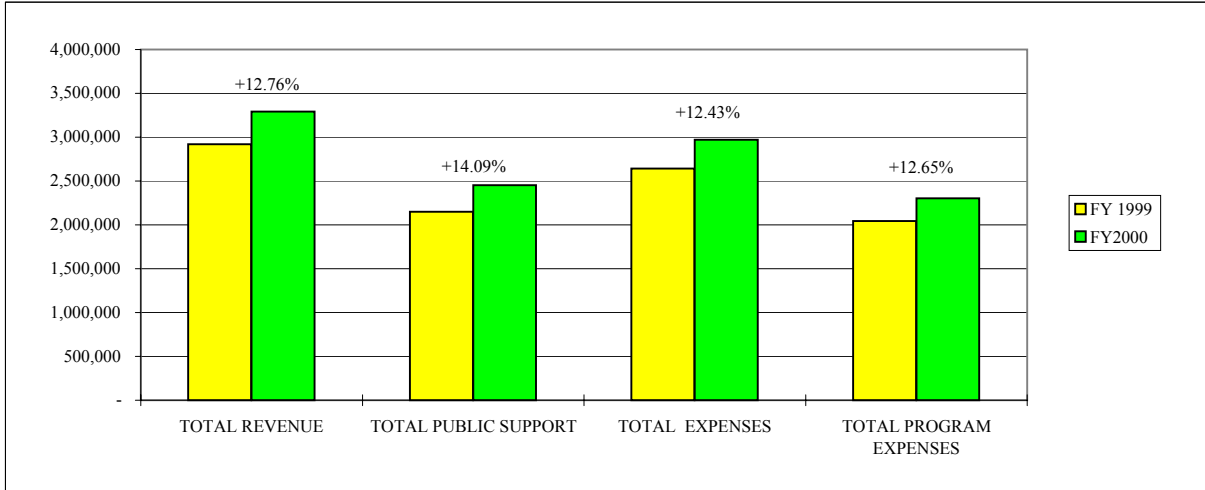
All Not-for-Profit Organizations are required to record their expenses in one of the major categories: Program Expenses, Management & General Expenses and Fundraising Expenses.

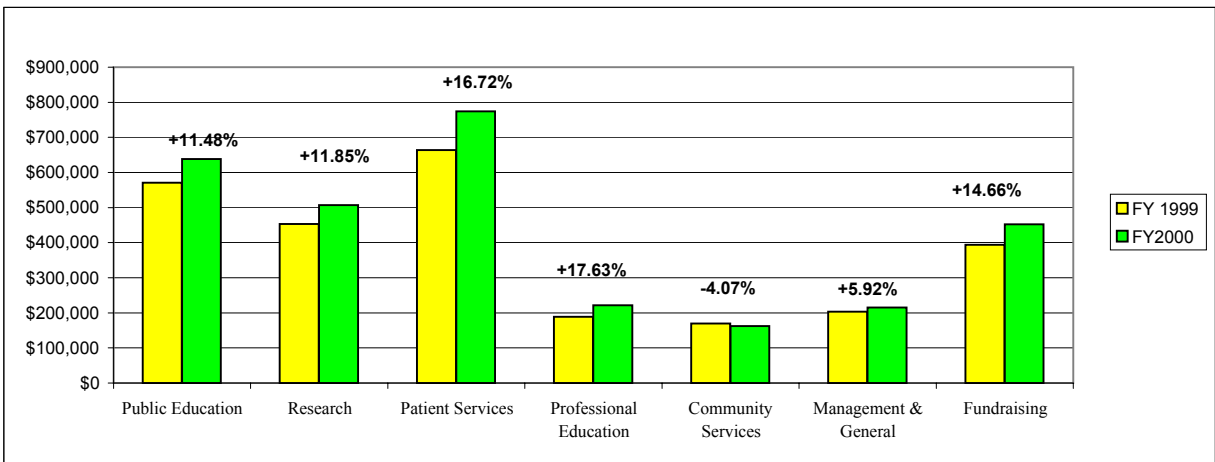

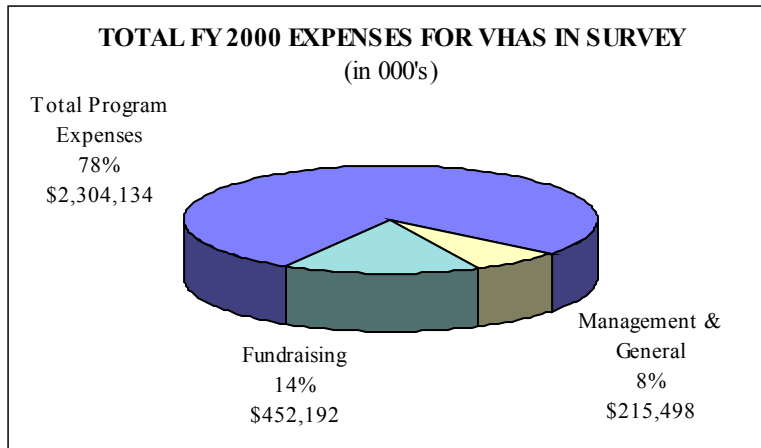

Management and General

The Category includes expenses for general board and committee meetings, executive direction and corporate planning, general staff meetings, office management, corporate legal services, personnel procurement, purchasing and distribution of materials, receptionist, switchboard, mail distribution, filing and other office services, organization and procedure studies, accounting, auditing, budgeting and external financial reporting, information technology, and internal financial and management reporting.

Fundraising

Costs incurred to induce potential donors to contribute money, securities, materials, facilities, and other assets. They include publicizing and conducting fundraising campaigns, maintaining donor mailing lists, conducting special fundraising events, preparing and distributing fund-raising manuals, instructions and other materials and conducting other activities involved with soliciting contributions from individuals, foundations, governments, and others.

Program Services

To better inform those seeking financial information about their operations, voluntary health agency members of the National Health Council typically use five standard classifications for program services in accordance with the Standards of Accounting and Reporting for Voluntary Health and Welfare Organizations. These program classifications are definitive, yet broad enough to permit an agency to fit all its program service expenses into one standard category or another without distorting the program's significance. These five functional categories are as follows:

Public Health Education - Programs conducted for the purpose of informing the general public how to promptly recognize the symptoms of ill health, disease, and/or physical disorders. Also included is the dissemination of facts and information designed to encourage periodic physical examinations and other appropriate health behaviors, to reduce indifference toward health problems, and eliminate unwarranted fears or misconceptions.

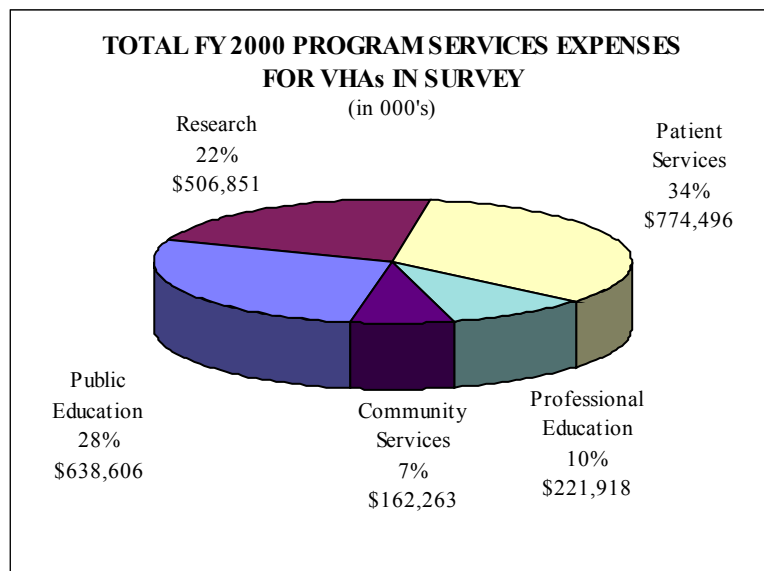
Research -Awards or grants-in-aid to support scientific studies or investigations plus all other costs or expenses incurred while conducting a program in which new knowledge is being sought to find causes, cures, and prevention for specific diseases or health problems.

Patient Services - Activities performed or programs conducted for the purpose of providing physical, emotional, and other assistance to individuals afflicted with a disease or health impairment, or to their families. This category further includes the furnishing of medical care, hospitalization, equipment, drugs, and other tangible items to those in need, plus all other costs or expenses incurred as a result of assisting individuals while bedridden or incapacitated.

Professional Health Education and Training - Activities or program designed to improve the knowledge, skills, and critical judgment of physicians, dentists, nurses, and others engaged (directly or indirectly) in health work by keeping them abreast of new medical advancements, diagnostic techniques, etc. Includes educational opportunities for those who have displayed the interest and aptitude to enter the medical field or undertake scientific investigations, as well as expansion or improvement of health educational courses in universities or the like and stimulation of health and/or scientific careers.

Community Health Services - Activities such as the detection of disease or health problems, planning and improving community health practices, supporting clinics or other public health facilities, conducting rehabilitative and similar programs.
