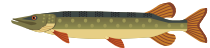

Divisions

The team entry fee of \$200 allows teams to enter one of five divisions. Teams can decide division while fishing:

PIKE DIVISION



Sponsored by Nor-Son
Weigh one pike

BASS DIVISION



Sponsored by Lindner Media
Weigh three largemouth bass

WALLEYE DIVISION



Sponsored by Navillus Land Company
Weigh three walleyes

PANFISH DIVISION



Sponsored by Nisswa Lions Club
Weigh three panfish, crappies, bluegills, sunnies or perch

MIXED BAG DIVISION



Sponsored by Brainerd General Rental
Weigh one pike, one walleye, one rock bass and one panfish

RON LINDNER BONUS
Bring in one rock bass, and this weight will be added to your fish total weight.

Division Prizes

The top 10 teams in each division (50 teams) will win a trip through the prize tent for your team with a combined team prize valued at a minimum of \$100 each. Nearly \$10,000 in prizes will be available including rods, reels, tackle, trolling motors, guided fishing trips, gear, a guided bear hunt, and much more.

Help us fill the event to the 150-team limit again this year. Last year we raised over \$445,000. With your help we can reach our goal to beat that record fundraising year.

Early Bird Awards

Enter now and start your fundraising right away! If both team members are registered by April 1, your team will be eligible for Early Bird prizes including AquaVu camera or fishing gear. One winning team will win complimentary lodging for six people (Wednesday before the Mn Fishing Challenge through Saturday, June 4) at Sandy Beach Resort on Gull Lake's west shoreline for six people will be awarded in April.

Additional Fishing Prizes

- **Sea Foam Second Chance awards** – Ten teams not placing in the top ten of any division will be chosen by random drawing to win a case of Sea Foam Marine Pro motor treatment. Anglers must be present to win.
- **McDonald's Big Bass award** – The winning team will win a plaque and a giant Rapala lure autographed by the staff of Lindner Media.
- **Woods to Water Real Estate Big Walleye award** – A plaque and a giant Rapala lure autographed by the staff of Lindner Media will be awarded to the winner.
- **Beaudry Oil Ugliest Fish award** – The winning team will receive a plaque and bragging rights!
- **Sea Foam Scholarship** – The top three ranked student teams will receive two \$500 college scholarships. It doesn't matter what division and student team does not have to be in the top ten of the division. For example, winners could be 5th place in the walleye

division, 7th in the mixed bag, and 10th in the bass division.

Fundraising Awards

- **The top three fundraising teams** will win a fishing trip with Al Lindner, Steve Pennaz or guide Denny Pluimer.
- **Each team that raises \$500** will get their name in a drawing for a brand new Lund boat powered by Mercury and loaded with electronics from Minn Kota and Humminbird. For each \$500 raised, you get another ticket in the drawing.
- **If you can raise \$1,460** you will be awarded an official 2022 Fishing Challenge personalized jersey at the Rules Dinner.
Funds must be collected by May 11 for shirt delivery at the Rules meeting.
- **All teams who raise \$3,000** or more, will receive two 16" x 20" copies of the commissioned print by Stuart Nelson.



Team Recruitment Award

Each team that recruits a new team will be entered in a drawing to win a \$1,000 Fleet Farm shopping spree! New teams consist of both partners who have not fished the event previously. You get one entry for each new team you sign up! You must be listed as the team who invited them on their entry form to get credit for it.

Participant Agreement

 - I acknowledge I am voluntarily participating in the Minnesota Fishing Challenge and am aware that this creates the risk of serious personal injury or death and loss or damage to personal property.
