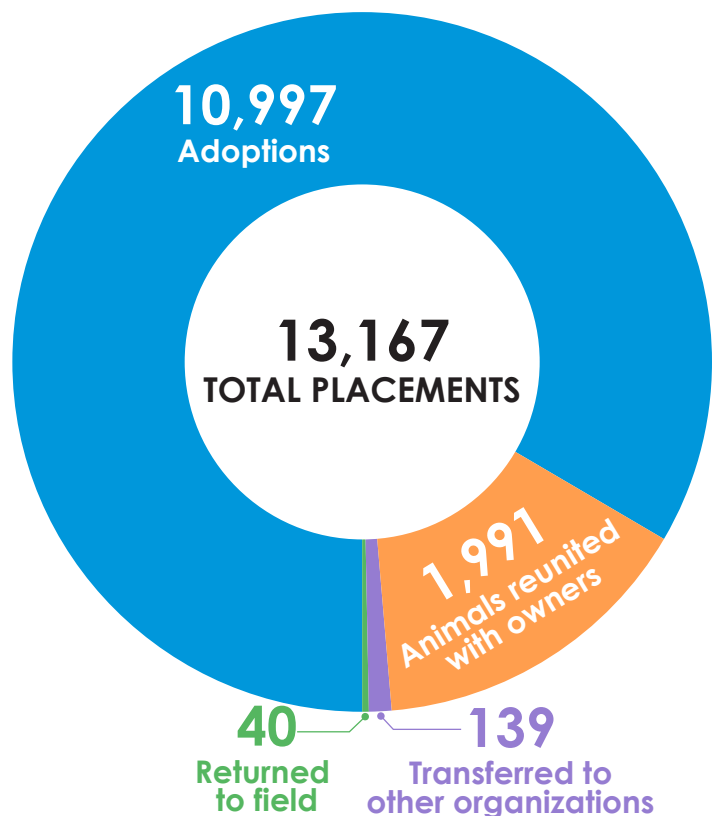
The Wisconsin Humane Society's mission is to make a difference for animals and the people who love them.

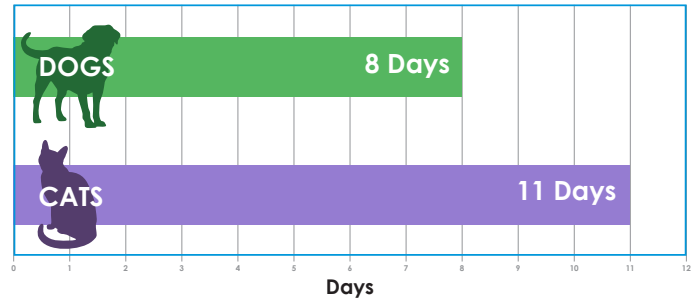
